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### MO'S CLAM CHOWDER BASE SALE \$10.00 PER QUART

Your milk and one quart of base makes two quarts of soup. We will take orders for the chowder base from now through March 13. Sandra Martin will pick it up in Newport and bring it to the March 20 meeting. The base is refrigerated, not frozen, so you will need to pick up your order at club on the 20<sup>th</sup>. The base has a shelf life of 10 days in the fridge, but you can freeze it.

Think gifts, and please ask everyone you know if they would like to order a few quarts of base!! Orders will need to be prepaid, so please make out your checks to Portland's Rain of Glass or list your credit card information on the order form.
